Tom Jackson was named President and Chief Executive Office of Tomball Regional Medical Center in 2014 and has been an active member of the community throughout his tenure, serving on the board of the Greater Tomball Chamber of Commerce, the Woodlands Chamber of Commerce and participating in several organization's throughout the region. During Tom's tenure at TRMC, he has worked closely with community stakeholders, physician leaders and the Board of Trustees to develop a very progressive strategic vision for the hospital and its affiliated physician clinics, emergency medicine centers and the Texas Sports Medicine Center. Numerous development and quality initiatives are currently underway including single-site robotic surgery, emergency center expansion and throughput, physician recruitment and Enhanced Recovery After Surgery.

Raised in a small town in central Arkansas, Tom's parents were in the medical profession and highly influential in his career choices.
