WHO WE ARE

The ACHE – SouthEastTexasChapter (**ACHE-SETC**) is a regional (covering 29 SE TX counties) professional affiliate of the American College of Healthcare Executives’ national professional society of more than 40,000 healthcare executives who lead hospitals, healthcare systems and other healthcare organizations. **ACHE – SETC** is proud to make available academic scholarships to outstanding graduate students in health administration/health services management programs for the sole intent of helping them fund their education.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

The scholarships listed on the right each have a value of \$5,000. Each year **ACHE-SETC** may award up to a total of 5 academic scholarships.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Applicant is required to be a 2017 paid dues Student Associate of ACHE and live in the southeast Texas area. However, during the selection process, preference will be given to applicants who have been Student Associates of ACHE at least six months prior to applying.
- Applicant must be enrolled in his or her final year (fall/Spring) of full-time study in a recognized health administration graduate program (MHA, MBA, MPH) in southeast Texas and have a graduation date between Sept. 1, 2017, and Aug. 31, 2018. Students enrolled in executive, doctoral programs or on-line universities are not eligible.
- Currently enrolled in a HA program in which the university must be a member of ACHE’s Higher Education Network (HEN) and the HA program accredited by either CAHME or AACSB.
- Applicant must have a GPA of at least 3.5 prior to applying.
- Applicant must demonstrate financial need.
- Applicant must be a U.S. or Canadian citizen.
- Applicant has participated in at least two **ACHE-SETC** sponsored events within the past year.
- Applicant cannot be a previous recipient of any **ACHE-SETC** scholarships (academic or ACHE Congress).

HOW TO APPLY

- Visit ache-setc.org/Scholarships beginning May 8, 2017 download and complete the application. Print ALL your information legibly
- Be sure to include the following with your application:
 1. Typewritten response to the case study that does not exceed 5 pages, not including title page and references. Appendix of 1-2 pages acceptable.
 2. Current resume, current transcript, and two letters of recommendation, one of which must be an academic reference.

Health Services Administration (ACEHSA) to the Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Management Education (CAHME).

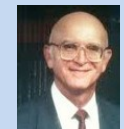
Dr. David J. Fine, FACHE
