

Mark Young has worked in the healthcare field since 1989 and specialized in the community healthcare field since 1998. He has a Master's in Business Administration from Trident University and a Master's in Organization Management from the University of Phoenix. Over his career, Mr. Young has worked with initiatives in the Rio Grande Valley, Northeast Texas, and South Texas. Projects he has developed include outreach and engagement with colonia residents (an unincorporated community in South Texas) and residential treatment services for pregnant women and children. Mark Young developed a tuberculosis intervention program, multiple chemical and alcohol dependency programs, behavioral health programs, and many outreach, education, and intervention projects.

Since 2010, Mark Young has led as the CEO of Stephen F. Austin Community Health Center (Community Health Network), with clinic locations in Brazoria, Galveston, and Harris Counties. Mr. Young and Community Health Network's focus extends all life cycles from newborn to geriatrics, with a new emphasis on elder care and hospice. Community Health Network provides behavioral health services and medication-assisted treatment that is integrated into primary care. He is leading Community Health Network in strategies focused on access to care, patient engagement, @home health services, clinical research, functional medicine, and whole-person care. In addition, Community Health Network develops proprietary technology, including blue-tooth enabled RPM with a chronic care management dashboard, a data warehouse with a reporting system, EHR, patient portal, patient mobile app, resource management, and customer relations management.
