Director, Value Based Care – Houston Methodist Coordinated Care



Zachary Menn, MD is the Director of Value Based Care at Houston Methodist Coordinated Care (HMCC). In this role, he is responsible for leading strategic clinical initiatives to reduce excess utilization of health resources, while improving patient outcomes for defined populations within our Accountable Care Organization (ACO). Dr. Menn leads teams of Nurse Care Managers, who work across multiple value based programs to reduce hospital admissions, readmissions, and Emergency Department visits, through patient education about specific healthcare needs, development of individualized care plans, and coordination of care with the patient’s physicians and external resource programs to address identified social needs.

Dr. Menn also leads clinical efforts for improving patient outcomes after hospitalization, including Skilled Nursing Facility Physician partnerships and Home Health review, to improve the cost and utilization performance of the ACO. He believes that coordination of care across the healthcare continuum is the key to reducing cost, while improving health outcomes for a patient population.

Dr. Menn has a background in physician recruitment and education, population health management, and clinical data aggregation and presentation. He has been working with population health and value-based care teams for 6 years. Prior to his time with HMCC, Dr. Menn received his B.S. in Biomedical Science with a minor in Business Administration from Texas A&M University, followed by a Medical Doctorate from American University of the Caribbean. After medical school, Dr. Menn completed a post-doctoral clinical research fellowship focusing on Reconstructive Microsurgery. He finished his formal education at the University of Houston – Clear Lake, where he received both a Masters in Healthcare Administration and a Masters in Business Administration.
